#### **SYNOPSIS**

After a long civil war, England enjoys a period of peace under King Edward IV and the victorious Yorks. But the king's younger brother Richard, Duke of Gloucester, resents Edward IV's power and the happiness of those around him. Malicious, power hungry, and bitter about his physical difference, Richard plots to seize the throne. A prophesy has arisen that the current king, Edward IV (who is already ill), will be murdered by one named "G." Richard convinces the king that the "G" stands for George, Duke of Clarence (Richard's and Edward's brother). Wary, Edward imprisons Clarence in the tower to await further judgment.

Next, Richard halts the procession accompanying the casket of the former King Henry VI. Over Henry's coffin, Lady Anne, daughter-in-law of former King Henry IV and wife of Prince Edward (both of whom Richard has murdered), curses Richard; yet Richard still wins her for his bride. Richard's next step is to cause the murder of his brother George, Duke of Clarence—the next in line for the throne. After insinuating that Clarence committed treason, Richard arranges for him to be murdered while imprisoned. Richard is now positioned to serve as regent to King Edward IV's son (also named Edward), the Prince of Wales, until the young Prince comes of age.

King Edward IV succumbs to illness. Richard sends his nephews (Edward, Prince of Wales, and his brother), to the Tower—to better "protect" them. He then moves against the court noblemen who are loyal to the princes; Rivers, Hastings and Grey are imprisoned and later executed. With Queen Elizabeth and the princes now vulnerable, Richard's political allies, particularly Lord Buckingham, campaign to have Richard crowned king. After a clever planting of insinuations regarding the illegitimacy of Edward IV's children, Richard ascends to the throne as Richard III.

By this time, Richard has alienated even his own mother, who curses him as a bloody tyrant. Recognizing the need to strengthen his claim to the crown, Richard sends a murderer to dispose of the princes. Buckingham, until now Richard's staunchest ally, begins to question his allegiance to Richard. When rumors begin to circulate about a challenger to the throne who is gathering forces in France, noblemen defect in droves to join him. The challenger

is a descendent of the Lancaster family—Henry Tudor, Earl of Richmond

Richard, insecure and paranoid about his claim to the throne, has his wife (Queen Anne) murdered so that he can pursue a marriage with his niece—young Elizabeth, daughter of dead King Edward IV and former Queen Elizabeth. Queen Elizabeth manages to forestall Richard and secretly arranges an alliance with Richmond. In one final ruthless act, Richard captures his former ally Buckingham on his way to join with Tudor's armies and has him beheaded. Former allies have all turned against Richard to join forces with Richmond.

On the eve of the battle, Richard is visited in dreams by the ghosts of all those whom he has slaughtered. Richmond's forces defeat Richard's army at the Battle of Bosworth Field. Richmond accepts the crown as Henry VII, he marries Elizabeth of York, thus uniting the white rose (the Yorkists) and the red rose (the Lancastrians). This is the founding of the Tudor line of kings and the end of the Wars of the Roses.

#### **ARTIST PROFILES**



**R.W. Berky** (he/him) is an OBIE, Edinburgh Fringe First, Kennedy Center Roger L. Stevens, and Sarett National Playwrighting award-winning performer. Berky has performed in theatre festivals worldwide and been visiting artist/master teacher at many universities nationally and internationally. He directed movement and clowning for Joseph Papp's NYSF production of *Twelfth Night* at the Delacorte Theatre, assistant

directed for John Tillinger's production of A Flea In Her Ear at The Long Wharf Theatre, and worked as a teaching artist for the Lincoln Center Institute in New York. As Artistic Director of Off Square Theatre for seven years he directed many productions, taught, and wrote original pieces performed by youth actors and adults in the Teton area. In 2015, he joined Global Arts Corp (GAC), part of the directing team for See You Yesterday, a physical theatre piece starring 19 Cambodian circus performers, exploring the Cambodian genocide's relationship to young Cambodians of today. SYY premiered in Phnom Penh in 2016, toured in Rwanda in 2017, throughout Cambodia in 2018, and had its U.S. premiere at Arts Emerson in Boston, Massachusetts, in May of 2019. At present he works on the newest GAC project, creating radio islands between young people, ages 9-12, all over the world. This 10-year project will connect kids through radio, creating stories about their lives and cultures to be shared, and providing a platform upon which the "islands" can create stories together. Mr. Berky has just published his first novel, "The Little Book of Wonders."



**Dena DeMarco** (she/her) Originally from San Diego, Dena was hired to costume OST's youth musical Beauty and the Beast, Jr. by answering a job posting in Jackson Hole's local paper in 2017. Since then, Dena has costumed all the OST youth musicals, most recently costuming What the Constitution Means to Me, directed by Allison Watrous. She has also assisted with Thin Air Shakespeare for the past five years and is

excited to continue this work by designing *Richard III*. Dena enjoys working with such a talented team and looks forward to the rest of the 2023 OST season.
