We're so excited to see you audition for Lionel Bart's *Oliver!* Please carefully read all the information below so that you are prepared for this process. Don't forget to have lots of fun as you prepare and audition.

AUDITION SESSIONS – October 19 and 21:

You will register for **one** of the following sessions according to your age group. Please be prepared to stay for the entire length of the session, although you may be released early.

Each session will begin with a group vocal warmup and dance call. Following the group portion, each student will audition individually. See p.2 of this document for information on what to prepare for your audition.

OCTOBER 19 SESSIONS

- 4:30pm-6:00pm: Grades 3-5
- 6:00pm-7:30pm: Grades 6-12

OCTOBER 21 SESSIONS

- 9:00-10:30am: Grades 3-5
- 10:30am-12:00pm: Grades 6-12
- 12:30-2:00pm: Grades 3-5
- 2:00-3:30pm: Grades 6-12

CALLBACKS – October 22:

Not all students will be called back, but all students who audition should be available during the day on October 22. If you are called back, you will receive more details by the evening of October 21. If you are not called back, it does not mean you have not been cast – just that we have seen all we need from you.

MY AUDITION: WHAT TO PREPARE

When selecting material, please do not worry about age, gender, or accents. Pick something that you can have fun with and bring all the personality you want!

GRADES 3-5 – [materials here](#)

- Text – Select and prepare one monologue from the list provided. You may choose to memorize the text, but you are also welcome to bring the monologue to help you remember.
- Music – “Food Glorious Food,” Measures 27-36. Look for the START and END markers. A track with accompaniment is provided.

GRADES 6-12 – [materials here](#)

- Text – Please prepare a monologue (30-60 seconds) of your choosing. The monologue should come from a stage play or musical (not a movie or television show) and it should be memorized.
- Music – Please prepare 30-60 seconds of a musical theater song!
 - You may prepare a song of your choosing and bring piano sheet music for an accompanist to read during your audition.

OR

 - You may choose to prepare one of the provided songs that best fits your range (see materials folder for sheet music and accompaniment tracks).
