ABOUT THIS PRODUCTION

Welcome to the world of Charles Dickens! When Oliver Twist was first published in 1838, London had recently become the world's largest city – it would hold that title for close to 100 years. It was a city reeling from rapid industrialization and on the brink of modernization, full of previously unimagined wealth and almost unimaginable poverty.

It was within this setting that Dickens created the unforgettable characters and story of *Oliver Twist*. Critical of the treatment of London's poor, Dickens' story is a heartfelt coming-of-age tale of Oliver Twist, a young orphan who searches for home, for family, and (most importantly) for love.

Today, our community's youth will bring Dickens' classic tale to life for you – as a musical! We have been working intensely over the past two months with more than 50 students to create an onstage extravaganza featuring song, dance, and a healthy dose of theatre magic. The young people involved with this production are fearless and openhearted as they create this story anew for you. We are so grateful to them – just as we are grateful to you, our audience, for opening your hearts and minds to their world.

The ideas that fueled Dickens' novel are the same that fuel Lionel Bart's musical and Off Square Theatre's production: Despite society's inequities and man's inhumanity to man – there is always hope for a better world, if we can bring ourselves to imagine it.

Dena DeMarco is pleased to be designing/creating costumes for her sixth youth musical with Off Square Theatre Company! She began her costuming career in 2008 in San Diego and has worked on about 40 productions. She has an amazing job and a great team to work with and is looking forward to seeing the kids bring it all together and shine on the stage!



Melissa Elliott is a musician and teacher from Jackson, Wyoming. She is thrilled to be assisting in her fifth Off Square production as a music director. Melissa graduated from the University of Denver with a Bachelor of Music degree in Jazz and Commercial Music in 2019 and has been sculpt-

ing a musical life in her hometown since. She teaches private and group music lessons at Teton Music School, performs in various bands in the community, and is a singer/songwriter producing music under her alias, "Missy Jo." In the fall of 2023, Melissa performed in Off Square's 25th Anniversary show and was seen as Nina in Jackson Community Theater's production of Vanya, Sonia, Masha, and Spike. Melissa continues to hone in on her musical craft and is grateful to still be growing up in the Jackson Hole music and arts community.



Taralee Larsen Fairclough grew up in Jackson Hole, and she is thrilled to be back home in the mountains. Taralee's love for the theater began on the Off Square stage when she was eight years old, and she is thrilled to be co-directing a show that is dear to her heart. Taralee studied Musical Theater at Elon University and the University of Utah. She has had the opportunity to work with Broadway's Denny Berry, perform on professional

stages across the Mountain West, and work as a professional actress for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. She is so grateful for her supportive husband, her two little girls, and for a baby boy making his debut this June.



Sadie Frank is a Jackson-based actress, director, and producer and is honored to make her Off Square directing debut with Oliver! With Off Square, performance credits include The Thanksgiving Play (Logan); A Midsummer Night's Dream (Puck); and The Revolutionists (Charlotte). Other performance highlights include creating an original translation of Chekhov's Seagull and playing Nina; Alice in Arden of Faversham; and an operatic performance as the titular role in Offenbach's La Périchole. Her training includes a Bachelor of Arts in drama from Vassar College and a semester of study at the Moscow Art Theatre School in Russia.



Golden Garnick is a singing Cowboy actor hailing from the mountains of Wyoming. He has been passionate about acting since a young age, and when not performing, you can find him riding horses on his family's ranch or traveling to various central Asian countries sharing his cowboy heritage. He is a Juilliard graduate with extensive experience in film, having appeared in several movies,

including *Rust* alongside Alec Baldwin, *Blood for Dust* with Kit Harrington and Scoot McNairy, and *Outlaws* with Mario Van Peebles and John Carrol Lynch. He also made his TV debut in the Yellowstone spin-off series 1923, playing a co-star role. On stage, he has graced the stage of prestigious theaters such as The Public Theater in New York and Los Angeles' Hudson Theater. His favorite roles include King Arthur in *Camelot* and Huckleberry Finn in *Big River*.



All the way from sunny South Florida, **Jaclyn Hansen-Kaufman** is a recent graduate of Long Island University Post where she received her BFA in Musical Theatre. She has performed in numerous productions with the Post Theatre Company, Post Concert Dance Company, and more recently was a part of the production of *Annie Get Your Gun* at the Jackson Hole Playhouse. 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
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
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
