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SYNOPSIS

In Verona, the long-standing feud between two noble families – the Montagues and the Capulets – constantly breaks out into brawling on the streets.

A group of masked Montagues risk conflict by sneaking into a Capulet party. Young Romeo Montague, lovesick for Rosaline, falls instantly in love with Juliet Capulet, who is due to marry her father's choice, the County Paris. Although shocked by the discovery that their families are sworn enemies, both Romeo and Juliet are determined to marry, and use go-betweens to help them arrange a secret wedding.

Now married, Romeo attempts to halt a street fight between his closest friend, Mercutio, and Juliet's cousin, Tybalt. Upon Mercutio's death, Romeo kills Tybalt, for which he is banished. Friar Lawrence arranges for Romeo to spend the night with Juliet before he leaves for exile in Mantua. Meanwhile, the Capulet family grieves, and Lord Capulet moves Juliet's marriage to Paris to the next day.

In a desperate attempt to be reunited with Romeo, Juliet follows a plot devised by the Friar and fakes her own death. A message from the Friar fails to reach Romeo and, believing Juliet dead, he takes his life in her tomb after killing Paris who was there in mourning. Juliet wakes to find Romeo's corpse beside her and stabs herself.

Knowing that their feud has brought about the deaths of their children, the warring families are reconciled.



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
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
