

#### **DIRECTOR'S NOTE**

When Off Square first approached me about directing Sweeney Todd in the Black Box my first thought was, "impossible." How do you produce Sondheim's epic revenge masterpiece usually presented in much larger houses and transfer that feeling into a much smaller venue? My experience of Sweeney Todd had always been on a theatrically grand scale or on a movie screen. But as I began to ponder the idea, I realized how intimate this revenge story really is. Sweeney's psychological journey lends itself very well to an immersive performance. Not only does the audience get an up close view of Sweeney's mind and world, but the characters in the show could create a direct connection with the audience. The audience becomes the other character in the story. Sondheim originally wrote the show to be performed in a small dark theatre where audiences would be equally charmed by the humor and terrified by the story. It was only later, under the advice from Harold Prince, that it went to Broadway. I thought we would give Sondheim's original idea another go.

As I charted what this intimate Grand Guignol performance would look like, I began to research Victorian theaters and stumbled upon images of old abandoned music halls. They were filled with dust, cracks, shredded and distressed curtains, cracked windows — all creating the feel I wanted to evoke in our audiences. Each venue had a mysterious story to tell — time and abandonment mixed closely with a history of storytelling and entertainment. There was the spirit of performers and music in the air — maybe not seen in our temporal world but living closely within it. Perhaps this experience would be a haunting of sorts. I sat down with Tina Anderson, our amazing scenic designer, and we set about creating a world of bygone theatrical style mixed with the intimate and powerful ambience of an immersive type of haunting. It is the Halloween season after all.

While we were thinking about how this performance would look, it was also paramount that we bring in someone who could tackle Sondheim's extremely beautiful but equally complex composition. That is when providence occurred and I met Alec Steinhorn. Not only is Alec a musical genius but his affinity for Sondheim could not be stronger (just ask him about his lamp). Alec knows Sondheim's work, inside and out and when I told him our vision for this "Teeney Sweeney," he set about doing the impossible — re-orchestrating a score written for over 26 musicians to 4 and a considerably smaller cast. Add in the actors, designers, musicians and crew — all linked by our sheer love and admiration for this work, this music, and this storytelling — and the results are astonishing.

So here we are in the present with our intimate and ghostly adaptation of this extraordinary musical. Come for the eerie (and often very funny) journey...stay for the pie.


